

# Mythical Creatures Card Game

## How to Play:

Print on card stock and laminate for more durability if desired. Print 6 copies of the cards. Only keep 1 copy of the cat in the deck. The cat is like an “old maid” and cannot be matched.

Deal out 5 cards to each player. The goal is to get the most matches. On a player's turn they can either draw from the deck or ask one other player for a specific card. If the other player has the card, they must give it to them. If they do not, they can then draw from the deck. You can lay down matches only on your own turn.

Wild Card: This card that can match any card.

Miss Turie's Mix Up: If you get this card, all players put their cards in the center, mix them up and get back an even amount. Everyone gets 4 cards back.

Trade: If you get this card, you switch hands with the person to your left.

Steal: The player who gets this card can steal one card from another player's hand. Once these extra cards are used, they must be put at the bottom of the deck.

The first player with the most matches and the least amount of cards in hand wins.



## Unicorn




A mythical animal represented as a horse with a horn projecting from its forehead. Medieval Europeans believed the horn had healing properties.

## Dragon




A mythical monster, like a giant reptile. They are in stories around the world and usually breathe fire. They were dangerous creatures who hoarded treasure.

## Hydra



A Greek mythical legend. It was a many-headed serpent-like monster. For every head that is cut off two more grow in its place.

## Hippocamp



A mythical sea horse also called a hippocampus. The Greeks believed that the sea god Poseidon rode in a chariot pulled by a team of them.

## Phoenix




A mythical bird that lived for hundreds of years, but only one existed at a time. A new phoenix would rise from the ashes of the previous one.

## Pegasus




A pegasus was a famous winged horse from Greek mythology. He was pure white and carried thunder and lightning for Zeus, the king of the Gods.

## Griffin




A mythical creature that has the head and wings of an eagle and the body of a lion. Tales of this animal date back to 3300 BC.

## Kraken



An mythical squid that was rumored to be over a mile around. This was a Scandinavian myth and was said to be seen off the coasts of Norway. When it submerged it created a whirlpool.

## Loch Ness Monster



Many people reported seeing this large sea monster in Loch Ness lake in the Scottish highlands. It is said to have a long neck and many humps along its back.

## Sasquatch



Also called Bigfoot. This is a huge ape-like creature that lives in the woods of North America. Many people still search for it even today!

## Golem




This creature is a Jewish folklore. It was a clay monster brought to life to serve its master. They often become too powerful for their masters to control.

## Chimera



A mythical Greek creature said to have the head of a lion, the body of a goat and the tail of a snake. It was a fire breathing monster.

## Cerberus



A multi-headed dog with a serpent tail. It guards the gate of the underworld to prevent the dead from leaving.

## Cat



A small furry carnivorous mammal often kept as a pet by humans. They are good at catching mice.

## Miss Turie Mix Up



Everyone put your cards in the center and mix them up. Everyone gets 5 cards back. Any extra go in the deck.

## TRADE



Trade cards with the player to your left.

## WILD CARD



Use as a match for ANY card!

## STEAL



Steal a card from any player.
